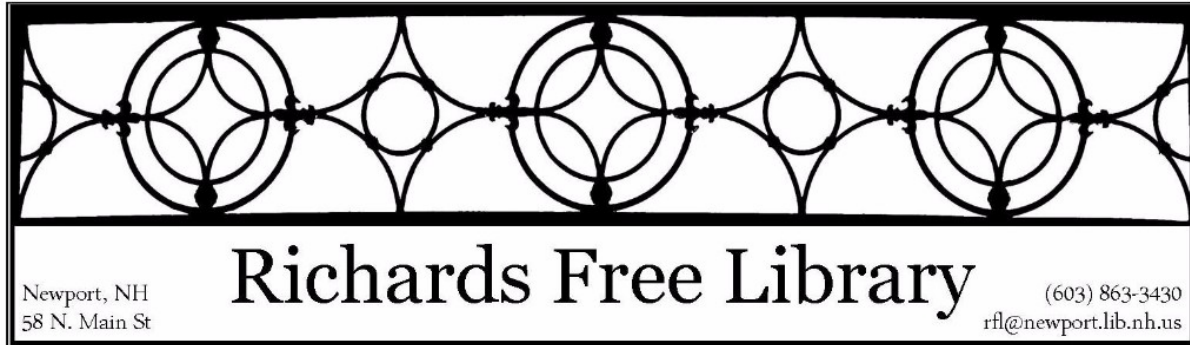

The *1000 Books Before Kindergarten* program is a fantastic way to build early literacy skills with your infant, toddler or preschool children while at the same time promoting family bonding, learning new vocabulary, and enjoying great literature.

If reading 1000 books seems daunting, think of it this way: if you read just one book a night, you'll finish in under 3 years, but you can finish in under a year if you read just 3 books a night!

A notary public is now part of our staff on Tuesdays. Please bring a valid photo I.D. and do not pre-sign documents.

Sign up today for a booklet to record all the books you read. Any book you read to your little one counts, even all the dozens of times you reread it. Every 100 books you read earns a star on our bulletin board and stickers to decorate it.
