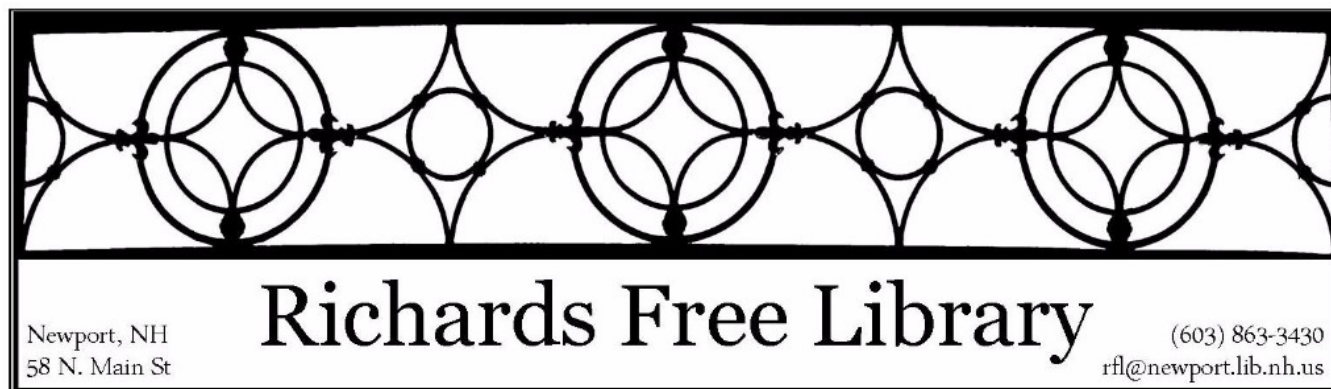

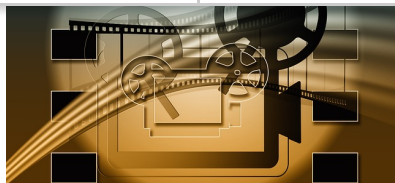
SELF SERVE INTERLIBRARY LOAN...
