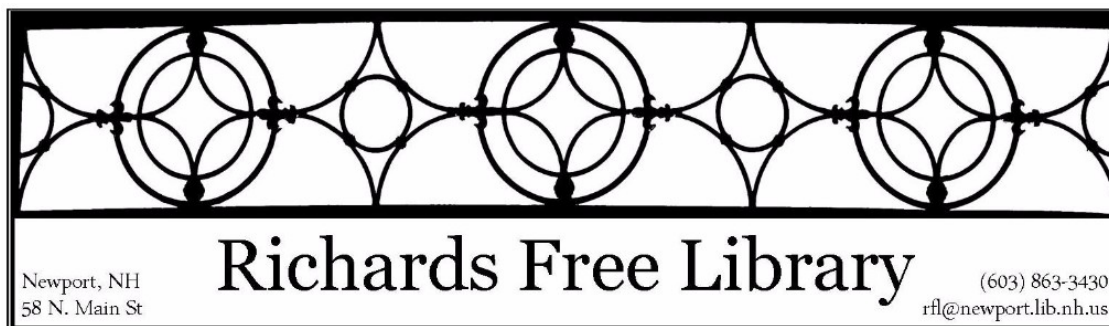

### DETERMINING COPYRIGHT

Did you know books published prior to 1924 are in the public domain? While the pre-1924 copyright rule is a safe one, it is not necessarily the end of the story.

The New York Public Library made an assessment that "only 25% of the books published from 1924 to 1964 are in copyright." The idea that 75% of the books published during this 40-year period had not renewed their copyright and had entered the public domain is thrilling. [Project Gutenberg](#) is a library of over 60,000 free ebooks.



### ADULT PROGRAMS

Looking to get out of the house more, meet new people? We have a number of adult programs at the library. 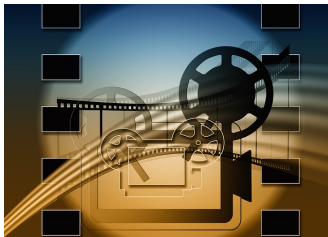
