

## Welcome to Newport History!

This guide will help you explore Newport's rich history, which began in 1766 as an agrarian community and soon became one of the leading manufacturing centers of New Hampshire. It also serves as a guide for research in any town, as similar resources are available elsewhere.

Most of the resources listed here can be found in the Richards Free Library, located in the Andler Room. These materials, designated with the CLOSED prefix to the Call Number when found in the library catalog, are available to the public on request. Ask any library staff member for the call number listed after each title. In the case of offsite resources, the location or URL follows each entry.
