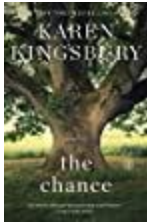


## CHRISTIAN FICTION



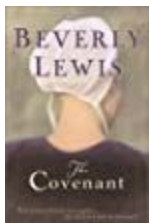

*Christy* by Catherine Marshall. A nineteen-year-old woman leaves her home to teach school in Cutter Gap, Tennessee, in 1912.



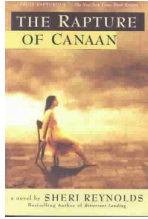

*Left Behind* by Tim LaHaye. After millions of people around the world vanish in one moment, in what many claim to be the Rapture, Rayford Steele begins a search for the truth amidst global chaos.



*The Negotiator* by Dee Henderson. FBI agent Dave Richman falls in love with Kate O'Malley, a hostage negotiator, during a crisis and must deal with the fact that she is not a Christian and that, because of her job, she is often endangered.



*The Rapture of Canaan* by Sheri Reynolds. Ninah Huff, the teenage granddaughter of the founder of an isolated religious community, causes controversy when she is discovered to be pregnant with what she claims is a holy child.



*The Shack* by William P. Young. Four years after his daughter is abducted and evidence of her murder is found in an abandoned shack, Mackenzie Allen Philips returns to the shack in response to a note claiming to be from God, and has a life-changing experience.



*The Tender Years* by Janette Oke. Marty and Clark's spiritual heritage has been lovingly passed on through the generations, and now their beloved granddaughter Virginia faces the test of her life, as she is caught in that difficult period between childhood and adulthood.
