

1. Fill out the form and give us as much information to work with as possible.
2. Library staff will take your favorite authors, titles, genres, and other factors into consideration and use our vast knowledge of books as well as the **Novelist** database to find personalized recommendations just for you.
3. We'll email you a list of recommended titles and authors to try.
4. You can email us back with a list of titles and/or authors you'd like us to pull for you and schedule a curbside pickup to come and get them!

Let's say you told us you love Jodi Picoult. We'd look through **Novelist** to find an author with a similar writing style who we have books by here in the library, on Libby, on Hoopla, or are able to borrow through inter-library loan. Your page(s) of recommendations would include snippets like this:

Author To Try: Chris Bohjalian

Both Jodi Picoult and Chris Bohjalian write thought-provoking novels featuring ordinary citizens facing extraordinary situations. Preferring to examine hot-button issues (transsexuality for Bohjalian, child abuse or teen suicide for Picoult, for example) in small town settings, their novels often take place in New England, where they both hail from.
